Training cum demonstration of artificial drier

On 10 November'05 CFC-FAO-ICRISAT project and NRCS

scientists organized training-cum-demonstration programme on uses of grain-dryer technology for the farmers of Mahaboobnagar district, . This process enhances utilization of sorghum and pearl-millet grains in poultry feed to improve livelihoods of small scale farmers in India. More than 100 men and women farmers from the district at KVK, Kothakotta participated. Dr. Ashok Kumar of ICRISAT explained to farmers the importance of good grain quality for poultry feed and Drs. Audilakshmi and Aruna delivered a lecture on five interrelated technologies to improve grain quality of kharif sorghums. They also demonstrated advantage of harvesting at physiological maturity and artificial drying of one tonne of sorghum produce in community drier to improve grain quality. This drier was installed by NRCS at KVK, Kothakota under NATP project.

NRCS Foundation Day celebrated

NRCS celebrated the Foundation day on 16 November quietly but with great enthusiasm. Following four different sessions were held.

Introspection session: Celebrations during "Foundation days" generally deals with retrospection, but NRCS did in a different way – Introspection (examining the growth prospects, future

challenges and thoughts). Staff from all categories reviewed "present status" and make suggestions to improve organization health and consider future prospects. The target is to make NRCS one of the best centres within ICAR system on developing efficient work and service culture.

Health session: Dr. RV Raghavendra Rao, General Surgeon, Medwin hospitals, Hyderabad delivered a lecture on Health

He also discussed various medical insurance schemes that can supplement CGHS.

Wealth session: Mr. Sashidhar, relationship manager – customer service and Mr. Hari Kishore, Head, ICRISAT branch of IDBI Bank, explained financial planning for the safe future, focusing on value investment and smart-banking.

Spirituality and Yoga session: Dr. Sumitha Roy, Professor in English, Nizam's College, OU, Hyderabad delivered a lecture on "Science and Spirituality". She stressed on the need to

Suresh Kumar and others also for making valuable contribution to this programme.

India Glycols Ltd., collaborates with NRCS for bio-ethanol production

The representatives of M/s. India Glycols Ltd., Khashipur, Uttaranchal, Dr. Jaisingh Saroj, Adviser (Cane & Agriculture) and Dr. Ashutosh Gautam, Asst. General Manager (ETP) visited the NRC Sorghum on 17 November, 2005 to know the

techno-economic feasibility of sweet sorghum cultivation for ethanol production. M/s. India Glycol is one of the biggest distilleries in Asia and largest producer of ethyl alcohol and its downstream products such as mono ethylene glycol (MEG), glycol, ethoxylates, PEGs, glycol ether from molasses. The team had a thorough discussion with the Director, Drs. SS Rao,

B Dayakar & CV Ratnavathi on a possible large-scale cultivation of sweet sorghum crop for ethanol production in the sub-tropical Tarai plains of Uttaranchal, and UP.

The team was informed that the excellent sweet sorghum cane yields can be obtained in subtropical climate on deep alluvial soil under high solar radiation and long days. Sweet sorghum crop may be the best option for summer as well as rainy season as a supplement to sugarcane. Invitation was extended to the NRCS team of scientists to visit the company for an assessment. It has been decided to sign an MOU between NRCS and Indian Glycols Ltd., on transfer of sweet sorghum technology.

Monitoring team visit of National Seed Project (crops)

The south zone monitoring team comprising of Drs. Hanchanal (UAS, Dharwad), Rajendra Prasad (UAS, Bangalore), Ponnusamy (TNAU, Coimbatore); Dr. SN Sinha (Head, regional research centre, Karnal), scientists and nodal officers from NSP units of ANGRAU, DRR and DOR visited NRCS on 28 Nov' 2005 for reviewing the breeder seed production
