### Meeting of ANGRAU – NRCS Researchers and Policy Makers



Researchers and policy makers from NRCS and ANGRAU met under the chairmanship of Dr. Padma Raju, Director of Research, ANGRAU on 16 August at NRCS. The main idea of the meeting was regarding sharing of technical know-how and

facilities between NRCS and ANGRAU. Dr. Padma Raju in his address stressed the need for multi-disciplinary approaches to tackle various problems pertaining to sorghum feed, food and fodder. He requested the scientists to adopt the benchmark farmers for scientific studies on sorghum. The University, he said will extend all needed cooperation to NRCS to popularizing sorghum in Andhra Pradesh. The discussion also centered on cultivation of sorghum in rice fallows in Krishna and Guntur districts, utility of tillering (and recovery resistance) types for avoiding losses from shootfly incidence, value addition to

sorghum products for popularization of sorghum, and concept of “organic feed” in poultry industry. Since sorghum is one of the cheapest and nutritious foods, Home Science Department of ANGRAU is also addressed to make attempts to compare rice and jowar foods on all aspects. The group also decided that Palem centre should be involved in sweet sorghum breeding along with NRCS, and Anakapalle be used as a testing centre. Based on demand, ANGRAU will plan for foundation and certified seed production of sweet sorghum along with AP seeds. NRCS should supply breeder's seed. Dr. VA Tonapi and Dr. M Elangovan coordinated this meeting.

### National level meeting on Sweet sorghum

A National level meeting on “Sweet sorghum utilization for ethanol production” on 28 August' 04 was organized by Agro Ecosystem Directorate, CRIDA with various entrepreneurs from private sugar industry and scientists from various research organizations involved in sweet sorghum research. Honorable Agriculture Minister, Andhra Pradesh, Mr. Raghuvveera Reddy, attended the meeting. Dr. SL. Mehta, National Director, NATP and the SAP members Drs. Kanwar and NGP Rao, Directors of CRIDA and NRCS also participated in the deliberations. The Agriculture minister highly appreciated initiatives taken on sweet sorghum development at NRCS.

### Varietal Identification Committee Meeting

The Varietal Identification Committee met under the chairmanship of Dr. G. Kalloo, DDG (CS & H) on 17 August, 2004 at ICAR, Krishi Bhavan, and New Delhi, along with the members: Dr. SN Shukla, ADG (FFC), ICAR, Dr. CD Mayee, Agri. Commissioner (Seed), DAC, Dr. V Sankaran, GM (Marketing), NSC, Beej Bhavan, Dr. LC Khairwal, PC (Pearl Millet), Mandore, Jodhpur, Dr. Shanmugam, Dy. Commissioner (Q & C) along with the Member Secretary, Dr. N Seetharama, Director, and Dr. S Audilakshmi, Principal Scientist at NRCS.

In all, 10 proposals received by the Coordinator were placed before identification committee. Those are SPV 1546; SPV 1595; SPV 1518; SPH 1290; SPH 1331; SPH 1342; SPH 1347; UPMCH 1101 and RSSV 9. A total of six proposals were accepted. Details are posted at NRCS website. We will submit these proposals very soon to CVRC for release of these cultivars at National level.

### Meeting on DBT Projects

On 7 August, A meeting was held at NRCS, Hyderabad to discuss formulation of Sorghum biotechnology projects for submission to DBT for their consideration.

The meeting was attended by scientists from ICAR and from UAS Dharwad, Bangalore, Osmania University, TNAU, Coimbatore, ANGRAU, Hyderabad, University of

Pune, Pune, RRS-UAS, Bijapur, MRPUA&T, Udaipur, CCS HAU, Hisar, NBPGR-RS, Hyderabad. In all 11 presentations were made. Then proposals are now being collected for subsequent evaluation by the DBT.

### The Farm Research Committee (FRC) Meeting

The institute FRC meeting was held on 7<sup>th</sup> August. During the discussions, it was decided that 20-25 ha land area has to be surveyed, maps prepared, leveled including creating drainage and channels systems. Enquires to be floated from contractors and initiate action to fabricate planter and buying a new tractor. Saplings of *Pongamea pinnata* (Bio-diesel tree) be planted on the unused land in terraces keeping the first 100 m land free for normal cultivation, and take necessary action to prepare the pits and go for transplanting of the saplings after survey is completed.

### Participation of NRCS in Exhibitions

**Exhibition at Guntur :** Sweet sorghum and its products. were exhibited at the exhibition organized by RARS, Lam farm, ANGRAU, at Guntur on 8 August, 2004. Honorable Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Dr. YS Rajasekhara Reddy and Former Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Digvijay Singh visited the exhibition. They were briefed on the research and development activities on sweet sorghum and its commercialization especially for ethanol production. He was also briefed

about seed distribution efforts made by NRCS in the areas affected by drought in Andhra Pradesh.

**AGRITEX exhibition:** An AGRITEX exhibition was organized jointly by TNAU and Government of Tamilnadu at Coimbatore from 20-26, August, 2004. NRCS also exhibited the products of sweet sorghum in collaboration with Renu Lakshmi Agro Industries, Coimbatore.

### Tableau on Agriculture wins Prize

The state department of Agriculture, Andhra Pradesh had exhibited a tableau on the theme of sweet sorghum and bio-fuel production on the eve of Independence Day parade at Parade grounds, Secunderabad on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2004. The exhibits on sweet sorghum and bio-fuel production contained in the tableau were the exclusive contributions of the NRCS. This tableau won the second prize out of 21 tableaus exhibited.

### Nomination

The Council has nominated Dr. TG Nageshwar Rao, Principal scientist (Pathology), NRCS as the member for the Management Committee, Central Tobacco Research Centre, Rajahmundry, for a period of 3 years w.e.f. 6 July 2004 to 5 July 2007.

## AICSIP NEWS

The status of kharif trials conducted during 2004 is listed below:

The AICSIP Centres at Coimbatore, Deesa and Pantnagar reported that the trials are in good condition.

Surat : Agronomy experiments affected due to heavy rains. Re-sowing was done for breeding trial as it was submerged in water due to heavy rains.

Mauranipur, Udaipur and Dharwad: Crop in satisfactory condition.

Palem: Trials are affected due to acute shortage of water. Rainfall will decide the crop status.

Indore: Breeding trials affected due to shortfall of rain.
